

Standards Development Principles




- Support positive child outcomes linked to school readiness
- "Few and powerful"
- Understandable, relevant, and intuitive
- Measurable and feasible to monitor
- Progressive/distinct among the levels

Portfolio System

- Balance of evidence
 - Documentation
 - Report
 - Observation
 - Data
- Reviewed by Early Learning Specialists

Spark Standards Structure

Domains

- Overall categories of quality
- 5 Total



Standards

- Program standards, organized by domain
- · 33 Total

Indicators

- Star levels of standards
- Usually 3 per standard
- Some standards only have 1 or 2 indicators

Evidence

- Found in portfolio only
- Measurable structural indicators that standard is present in program

Spark's 5 Tier Building Block System





Star Level Indicators: Building Block



Other Spark Details



- Spark rating by licensed site
 - Multiple-site portfolio available during Quality Rating Phase
 - Only licensed programs can participate
- Head Start, Oregon Programs of Quality (OPQ) and programs accredited by National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), National Association for Family Child Care (NAFCC), Association of Christian School International (ACSI) eligible for accelerated process
- Materials available in Russian and Spanish

Alternative Pathway



- For programs that are not licensed by Early Learning Division
 - Office of Child Care does not have authority to license programs run by school districts and Educational Service Districts (ESD)
 - Holds current programs harmless if license expires between now and time alternative pathway is in place
 - Programs will keep star rating through the transition between licensing and the Alternative Pathway being developed





Coordinated System with Key Early Learning Partners



- TRI (The Research Institute)
- OCCD (Oregon Center for Career Development)
- CCR&Rs (Child Care Resource & Referral)
- ELD/OCC (Early Learning Division/Office of Child Care)



The Research Institute (TRI)



TRI is responsible for the administration of Spark, including:

- Technical Assistance (TA) for Quality Improvement Specialist (QIS) and other early learning system partners
- Processes including supports and incentives, portfolio review, compliance review and rating maintenance





 OCCD partners with Spark by providing information and TA regarding professional development planning and tracking.





 CCRR&Ss engage and support programs' participation in Spark within their local communities.



Early Learning Division (ELD)



 Early Learning Division provides the funding and leadership for Spark. ELD is responsible for all final decisions related to Spark.
