

Spark Quality Improvement (QI) Cycles **Goal Selection and Resources**

Here are some examples of goals along with potential resources to help you select and achieve them. These examples and resources serve as a starting point and do not represent all available options.

To identify a meaningful goal, consider various sources of information, such as program observations, feedback from family surveys, or insights from child screenings and assessments. If you are working on completing a Spark portfolio, you can also use the portfolio or the portfolio self-assessments in any of the domains for ideas.

Your chosen goal should contribute to improving overall program quality, enhancing outcomes for children, supporting program sustainability, or addressing another key priority within your program.

Goal Examples by Spark Domain with Resource Ideas

Domain: Learning & Development (LD)

Goals related to providing high-quality, developmentally appropriate experiences that support each child's growth and learning.


